Something New:

Continuing at the March 6th meeting we'll have the Show and Comment. This will be an open critique of projected digital images. Anyone may bring up to four digital images to show. Use jpg to keep file sizes down. The file name structure of MONTH YEAR PHOTOGRAPHERS NAME_IMAGE NAME will make it easy to sort the photos. Maximum file size should be 500 KB. The compression, (probably around 7-10), is recommended to get a file size of about 300-500KB. For easy down loading of your images to a laptop, store images on a flash drive (memory stick), or CD only. The Show and Comment will follow our refreshment break, before the slide competition begins. Our goal is to have PPCC's first judged digital projected imaging competition in June.

Spring Scavenger Hunt Rules:

- The best two of three in a category will be counted, to be judged from a single roll of 36 exposure slide film.
- We request that there will be no slide cropping.
- We request that no digital test shots be utilized prior to shooting with film camera.
- Shooting Start on <u>March 1st</u>
- Judging will be <u>March 27th</u> (slides need to be dropped at Living Springs Worship Center by 7:00PM) March 27th). Anyone not wishing to attend the March 27th judging needs to get their slides tome prior to the 7pm that evening.

• Judging will be in two parts – up to 5 points awarded for how well the photograph fits the category's subject, and the remaining 5 points awarded for the general impact of the photograph. Technical merit, exposure, composition, focus, etc. will be used as a tie breaker.



Then working our way down the day warmed and the cool ice formations disappeared. The time was around noon, and the group broke up and headed off in different directions.

It was a good morning shoot, Tom and I had lunch at the Trading Post in the Garden of the Gods. Then around 2pm I went to Fountain Creek Regional Park and shot some wildlife. I saw a good number of Canada Geese, Teal, Hooded Mergansers, Red Winged Blackbirds, and different types of ducks. I wrapped it up around 3:30pm to meet the Family for my Nephew's birthday party later that evening.
