### Field Trip Review:

The day of September 22, 2007 was a fine day. The weather was mild with a slight breeze when we met at the Park and Ride. As I pulled in around 10:50 am I noticed Bill Stanley and Rita Steinhauer, shortly thereafter, Andy de Nary showed up. We waited around a while and then the four of us headed up to Rocky Mountain National Park.

As Andy and I got into Estes Park my cell phone rang, and it was Rita letting me know that she and Bill were at the Fall River Visitor Center. I did a quick lane change and hopped on CO 34, and

met Bill and Rita shortly after. As we talked out the plan for shooting the elk, Ron James called me on my cell and let me know that he and Deb were at the Fall River viewing area, and would meet us there.

Before we reached the Fall River viewing area I spotted a herd of elk across a meadow. The cow elk were bedded down at the edge of the trees and a bull elk was bugling. Those elk were too far to photograph so we continued up the road to find Deb and Ron. At the next major pull off and viewing area I saw Ron James with camera in hand. He and Deb were looking at a big herd across a meadow. The herd was starting to move from the trees and willows at the edge of the meadow into the meadow itself. We all watched the elk for a while, and then I decided to head up the road and see if we could find other elk.

Bill and Rita joined Andy and I, while Deb and Ron chose to stay and watch the herd at Fall River. I took the Trail Ridge Road to see if we could find elk in two small clearings that I knew of. There were no elk there like, so we went on the Upper Beaver Meadow road. Here we saw a nice 6 point bull elk with a small group of cows. They were close too! The only thing they did though; was lay around chewing their cuds. What?! It's rutting time! Get up and do your stuff... After a while of waiting for the bull to get active, which he never did, (I guess he had already taken care of business, and it was time to be lazy.) We continued around the park.

As we continued our search for the active bull, we saw a good group on the side of the road just after ol' lazy bull. Another close group, wow! I stopped the Blazer, and we got out to photograph them. I hope somebody got this fine herd. My POS Nikon gave me an ERR code when I turned it on. While the others were doing photography, I was reading the manual, and changing to a faster film in my other camera. Okay, I'm ready now. With the trusty N80 loaded with 400 speed film, I was ready to shoot. But by the time I was ready, the heard of elk had moved into the trees. With this opportunity blown, at least for me, we continue on down the road.

Our next stop was at the northern end of Moraine Meadows. Wow, elk everywhere! I stopped here just to check thing out. There were three herd bulls with their harems of cows, and several satellite bulls hanging around the different herds. As we watched, one huge bull gathered several cows from another bull. That almost resulted in a bull battle, but not quite. We spent a lot of time there watching and photographing. After photographing those herds for a while, I decide to see if lazy bull was up and active.

We got back to lazy bull just as the sun had set behind the mountain, and lazy bull was still lying in the same place. Wow, he must have been tired... From lazy bull we went to see what Deb and Ron were up to. We went back to Fall River and hooked up with the Jameses. We hung out there for a little while just watching and listening to elk. After enough watching and listening we headed down the road to Lyons for dinner.

### Projected Digital Images:

Anyone that competes in **PDI** may bring up to four digital images to show. Two for the Open category, and two for the Subject category. Use jpg format to keep file sizes down. The file name structure is: 06\_07\_Open(*or Subject*)\_Title, Your Name. This will make it easy to sort the photos. Maximum file size should be 500 KB. .jpg files 1024wx768h pixels max for horizontal, vertical 768h max. A color space of sRBG works good. The compression, (probably around 7-10), is recommended to get a file size of about 300-500KB. For easy down loading of your images to a laptop, store images on a flash drive (memory stick), or CD only. *If anyone has any questions about saving/ naming files please contact Tim Starr* (719-683-4347, timstarr@falconbroadband.net
