

The image was taken while exploring the Victor/Cripple Creek area with a friend. It just spoke of days gone by and the stories that were in the house. You can feel the history as you explore the old abandoned building - the history of the mining days. I shot at f1 I and 300mm. I had to take it from the road. I did slight adjustments in Photoshop, then I turned the image to black and white. I felt it had more impact in black and white.



"Sailing the Great Lakes" by Al Swanson

My wife and I were on an RV trip in Michigan. After we had left Mackinac, Michigan, we drove down to Alpena, Michigan on the eastern side of the Michigan Peninsula. As we often do, we checked in with the Chamber of Commerce to find out if there were any special events going on in the region. It turned out that the fleet of Great Lakes tall ships were going to pass by Alpena the following morning on their way to Duluth, Minnesota, for a static display. These ships tour the Great Lakes each summer and put on various demonstrations at selected ports. I had never seen any of these ships before. Alpena had a company that provided glass bottom boat tours to take tourists out to sunken relics off the shore. One of these ships was slated to go out to the tall ships the following morning and we were lucky enough to get two tickets on that voyage. So the boat took us 13 miles into Lake Huron where we met the ships at about 10 o'clock or so in the morning. It had been a foggy night so some of the ships could be photographed coming out of the fog. The mood took you 200 years in the past and gave you the feeling of that timeframe at sea. Our boat took us among several of the ships and the images were spectacular. Needless to say it was a once-in-alifetime event for me. I am still awed when I think about the day we saw these. They are unbelievable. I later found out that there are several of these fleets around the world. Most of them are made from renovated original ships or reconstructions. I shot this particular frame with a Canon 7D at F10, 1/320, ISO 200.
