This photo was taken on my first visit to Oklahoma to visit my granddaughter in October, 2019. She and her Navy husband are stationed at Tinker Air Force Base in Oklahoma City, OK. Imagine my surprise when they took me out to dinner on Lake Hefner, and we were happily surprised to see this lighthouse (privately owned) against this beautiful sunset after dinner. That is my granddaughter and her husband standing on the right side of the lighthouse.

The photo was taken with my Canon Power Shot SX50 on automatic or night sky (I forgot which). I was ecstatic to come back with about ten photos of this amazing lighthouse.



"Puerto Vallarta Native Dancers" by Bill Holm

This picture was taken in December of 2017 in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico. Every year in Puerto Vallarta from December I to the I2 they have a Procession of the lady of Guadalupe. It is a religious procession to take gifts to the church at Christmas time. They have native dancers, floats and bands that are in the procession. The people of the city line the streets and totally enjoy the yearly event. The dancers in this picture will stop several times throughout the procession and do a native dance and then move on. This dancer was very cooperative about having her picture taken. There are food vendors, there is enjoyment and a sense of anticipation of the upcoming season.

I shot this at a very high ISO of 10,000 because the light, and the dancers were moving, and I wanted to stop them. The shutter speed was $1/60^{th}$ of a second at f/4. I was using a 50mm fixed lens for this picture.
