The Colorado College Fine Arts Center is currently hosting a temporary display ~ Brett Weston, "Working Toward Abstraction".

Over his seven-decade career, Brett Weston (1911-1993) rose to prominence as a photographer with an eye for abstraction. No matter the location or subject - from city scenes to explorations of forests and beaches - Weston consistently revealed its potential for abstraction.

Selected from the museum's collection, the photographs in this exhibition represent a broad range of Weston's work, from the 1940s through the 1980s. I found this exhibit, and the short film documenting Weston's work throughout his career, to be most enjoyable, and I recommend it highly.

The exhibit ends April 17.

Looking ahead, on September 14, at 6:00, before our regular monthly meeting, Angela Crews and Don Kallaus will be presenting their recently published book, COLORADO SPRINGS, A changing Landscape.

"Photographers like it for the fact that it is composed of photographic challenges that encompass much local history. It features the work of local photographer, Glenn W. Murray, (1906-2004), and a group of student photographers in a quest to update his views. It illustrates the movement of not just history, but photography as well."
